## We Will Endeavour to

- Integrate the consideration of environmental concerns and impacts into our decision making and activities.
- Promote environmental awareness among our people and encourage them to work in an environmentally responsible manner.
- Train, educate and inform our people about environmental issues that may affect their work.
- Reduce waste through re-use and recycling and by purchasing recycled, recyclable, or re-furbished products and materials where these alternatives are available, economical and suitable.
- Promote efficient use of materials and resources throughout our synagogue including water, electricity, raw materials, and other resources, particularly those that are non-renewable.
- Avoid unnecessary use of hazardous materials and products, seek substitutions
  when feasible, and take all reasonable steps to protect human health and the
  environment when such materials must be used, stored, and disposed of.
- Purchase and use environmentally responsible products accordingly.
- Where required by legislation or where significant health, safety or environmental hazards exist, develop, and maintain appropriate emergency and spill response programmes.
- Communicate our environmental commitment to members, visitors and contractors and encourage them to support it.
- Our team will continually evaluate our efforts and strive to improve our environmental performance. To minimise the social impact and damage, by periodically reviewing our activities and environmental policy and credentials in light of our current and planned future activities to ensure we progress with our commitments.

- Water conservation
- Safe storage, use and disposal of chemicals and emissions, including CO2 Reducing our carbon footprint
- Waste minimisation and recycling Use of vegetable-based inks
